

SCRTAC Trauma Coordinator's Meeting
September 25, 2007

- 1) PI data that must be submitted to the state:
 - a) There are currently three items that must be submitted:
 - i) GCS <8 Without Definitive Airway in the hospital
 - ii) EMS Scene Time
 - iii) ED Length of Stay
 - b) It is difficult for III/IVs to get this hospital after transfer, so the Level I will report this de-identified data to the state on behalf of the III/IVs.
- 2) There is a registry workshop coming to our area on November _____, at the Sheraton Hotel, starting at _____. This will be very valuable to our trauma coordinators and trauma registrars.
- 3) Mass Casualty Incident vs. Multi Victim Incident: we need to encourage triage at ALL MVIs. Focus on this for both hospital and pre-hospital.
- 4) Surge Capacity: Janet Volk described her functioning surge capacity plan and will distribute this to the others. Others are encouraged to review and/or refresh their hospital's surge capacity plan, and how their hospital will communicate with other hospitals.
- 5) Site visits: new coordinator at Platteville is stressed about upcoming site review, and we need to communicate with her and provide continuing support. She has replaced Kurt Opgenorth at this position. The SWHC site review is slated for October 20th?
- 6) Peggy Sivesind from the Office of Rural Health: FLEX: Critical access hospital support (25 beds or less) 59 of these in the state. Grant awarded for \$615,000; broken down into smaller amounts for individual items. National Voluntary Consensus Standards for Emergency Care: Phase 1: Measures of emergency department transfer from one ER to another acute care hospital, looking at a variety of measurable data. She is looking for interested persons to join a teleconference tomorrow, the 26th of September, starting at 1430.
